
# We Are Proud of Our Impact

## In-Home Mentoring

### Growing as Parents

For pregnant or newly parenting young parents, including teens

Focus on building parent/child attachment combined with developmental assessments and goal planning to encourage staying in school and/or employment.

- 429** Parents and children served
- 92%** Improved protective factors
- 87%** Parents employed or in school
- 95%** Not referred to CPS



A gift of \$29 funds a home mentoring visit.

### Parent Aide

For families at elevated risk for abuse

Therapeutic services combined with positive parenting skills, family goal planning and developmental assessments to achieve a nurturing home environment.

- 185** Parents and children served
- 88%** Improved protective factors
- 92%** Parents employed or in school
- 92%** Not referred to CPS

## Community Education & Outreach

### Bringing Families Together

Serving families in transitional and supportive housing

- 203** Parents and children served
- 12** Communities impacted
- 78%** Improved protective factors against child abuse

### Healthy Outcomes through Prevention and Early Support (H.O.P.E.S.)

Provide nationally accredited Triple P parenting programs in the community

- 653** Parents and children served
- 45** Communities impacted
- 88%** Improved protective factors against child abuse

### Community Seminars and Classes

Education within schools, the local jail, childcare agencies and other non-profits

- 723** Parents and children served
- 212** Car seats inspected and/or provided
- 62%** Increased abuse prevention knowledge and skills

82% of agency resources go directly to program services.
