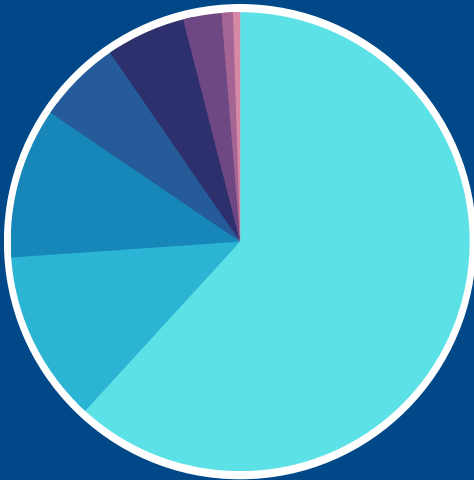

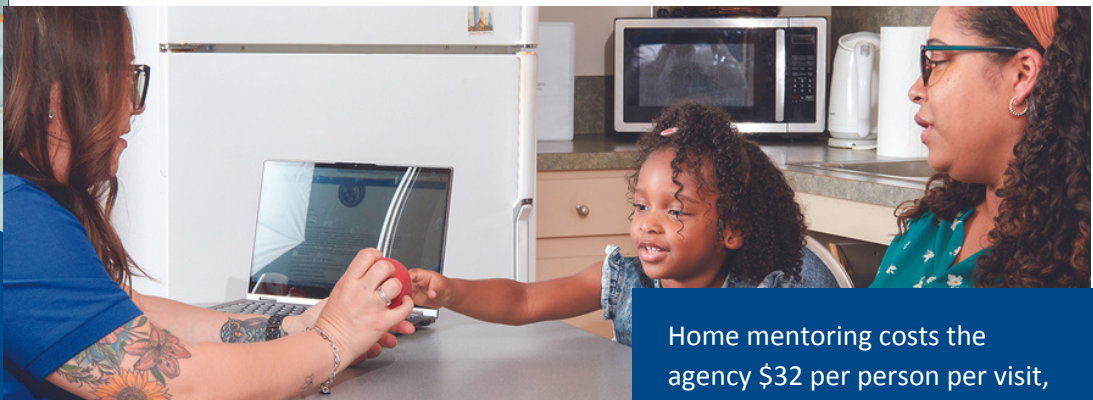
Home Mentoring

Growing As Parents (GAP)

For pregnant or young new parents, including teens

Builds parent-child attachment, administers developmental assessments, and implements goal planning to encourage parents to stay in school and/or employment.

394	Parents & children served
94%	Improved protective factors
93%	Parents employed or in school
97%	Not referred to CPS



Home mentoring costs the agency \$32 per person per visit, provided at no cost to families.

Parent Aide

For families at elevated risk of child abuse

Therapeutic services that teach positive parenting skills, family goal planning, and use of developmental assessments, ultimately achieving a nurturing home environment.

Bringing Families Together

Serves families in transitional & supportive housing

Implements the nationally accredited Positive Parenting Program (Triple P) to build confidence in parenting, deal with problem behavior, create nurturing and positive relationships, and teach parenting self-care

Community Education Classes

Provides education within schools, jails, childcare facilities, and other partner agencies
